
Through these aims, we aspire to inspire confident, compassionate readers who are well-prepared for a lifelong journey of learning and discovery.

#### Implementation

At Christ the King, reading instruction starts in Early Years with a focus on synthetic phonics using Read Write Inc. Children participate in daily phonics lessons that include speaking, listening, and spelling activities linked to their learning. For those who need extra support with decoding by the end of Key Stage 1, we offer 1:1 sessions in Year 3 to help bridge any gaps.

Once decoding is secure, we shift our focus to comprehension skills, allowing children to read age-appropriate texts fluently. Our weekly comprehension sessions, using diverse texts from Literacy Shed Plus, emphasize VIPERS skills: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval, and Summarising.

We also value the impact of reading aloud, dedicating 10 minutes daily to high-quality texts. Year 6 students act as reading buddies for younger peers, promoting a love for reading. Our 'Reading Raffle' rewards home reading, and our engaging library further inspires students to explore and enjoy literature.
