## **School Communication 2023-2024**

This year we will continue to send out a **monthly newsletter** to parents. Class teachers will also send out a **year group newsletter** at the start of each half term along with regular updates about the class on ClassDojo (see below). Information about your child's learning this year will be shared in the class newsletter and also posted on the year group pages on the school website.

During September class teachers will hold a **Meet and Greet** session with parents so that you can meet your child's teacher, see their classroom and familiarise yourself with the new routines and expectations for home learning, etc.

**Parent consultation meetings** will take place twice a year and parents will receive one written report. Parent consultation meetings this term are planned to be face to face, week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> October 2023 (Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> October).

Class teachers will be available on the door at the end of the day and may also be messaged on Tapestry or **ClassDojo**. Please email the school office for all other queries.

## <u>ClassDojo</u>

ClassDojo connects teachers with pupils and parents to build an amazing community where are all connected and informed. Foundation will continue to use Tapestry, along with Year 1, and Years 1 to Year 6 will use ClassDojo. Google Classroom accounts will continue to be used as our remote and home learning platform.

## **Start and Finish Times**

Our start and end of day routines will continue as follows: Parent/ carer may bring their child on site and drop off at the classroom / year group allocated door where there will be a member of support staff available to welcome each child and take any notes / queries. Teachers will be in the classroom engaging with the learning activities from 8.30am, but will be available on the door at the end of the school day. If you need a conversation with the teacher, please do message them on ClassDojo and they will either phone you or arrange a meeting.

At the end of the school day parents of pupils in Early Years to Year 4 are encouraged to collect their child from the classroom door. This ensures we hand over children safely at the end of each day and there is also an opportunity for teachers to catch parents should they need a quick hello. Parents of pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 have the option of collecting their child from the allocated door / area or to write a letter to the class teacher and office to give permission for their child to walk on / off site independently. The school keep a log of all walkers, and this is checked regularly.

Please ensure you inform the class teacher in writing of any persons who will regularly collect your child from school. We will not send a child home with any adults that we have not be notified of. If there is a change in pick up, please use our safe word system.

#### Safe Word System

If you need to change the person picking your child up at the last minute, please contact the school main office (NOT the class teacher) to give the following details:

- 1. Name of person collecting
- 2. Safe word.

The person collecting will give the safe word to the class teacher for your child to be released.

#### Uniform

**Uniform matters** - we pride ourselves on high standards of presentation. All pupils should wear the correct school uniform including a jumper or cardigan with the school logo.

**Hair styles** should be suitable for school – NO SHAVED cuts please. Shoes should be black - slip on shoes for girls are NOT encouraged as they inhibit safe playtime play.

**PE uniform** expectations are equally important and school logo PE T-shirt is advised. Navy shorts, sweatshirt top and jogging bottoms should all be plain navy with no logos. Leggings are not permitted. Please continue come to school in PE uniform on PE days.

### **Packed Lunches and New Hot Lunches**

Please remember that we are a NUT FREE school. Please ensure you check the ingredients of all items in packed lunches.

The new hot lunch system is now fully up and running. The food has received high praise indeed and all parents who require hot lunches for next week have placed their order prior to the deadline. Thank you to our wonderful Admin team who have worked behind the scenes to get the system operational and thank you to parents for your patience.

#### **Winter Illnesses**

As we move into the Autumn term, hygiene measures are increasingly important. Regular handwashing is crucial and class teachers will encourage children to do this.

We have visitor in school who has an autoimmune disorder. Their well-being may be affected by coming into contact with people who have chicken pox, measles or shingles. Please let us know if your child is off with any of these infections, so we can inform our visitor accordingly.

### **Summer Home Learning**

I hope that all pupils have managed to spend some time practising their basic skills in reading and maths. Teachers can monitor access to IXL and note the progress made over the summer. For some children this will mean that they start the term with confidence. Our English Leaders are looking forward to finding out which pupils took part in the reading challenge this summer. #### Season of Creation


Pope Francis established 1<sup>st</sup> September as the 'World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation' in 2015. The 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 marked the start of this year's Season of Creation. It ends on 4<sup>th</sup> October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. The theme for this year is "Let Peace and Justice Flow."

In this season of creation, the symbol of God's Spirit calls us to listen to the voice of creation, the cry of the Earth and awaken to the urgent need to heal our earth.

Pope Francis tweeted, 'This season of creation is an opportunity to cultivate our 'ecological conversion', a conversion encouraged by Saint John Paul II as a response to the 'ecological catastrophe' predicted by Saint Paul VI back in 1970.

Pope Francis calls us to respond with prayer and action. The children will start this new school year by revisiting 'Laudato Si' and what it means to Care for Our Common Home – to consider what we can do locally to help heal our planet.
