This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is taught in the music room every week and is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are a minimum of 40 minutes and are taught by our HLTA under the supervision of the Music Lead. Teaching is supported by specialist planning from 'Charanga'. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly whole school singing assemblies lasting 20 minutes. Children in Year 4 learn an instrument as a whole-class ensemble taught by music specialists from Soundstorm Music Service as part of the Wider Opportunities programme. Each project lasts 10 weeks and culminates in a concert where children perform songs and pieces together.

Children in Year 3 spend a term learning the recorder as a whole-class ensemble. This is taught by the HLTA using the Charanga scheme.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Christ the King Catholic Primary School, we currently offer individual and small-group lessons on drums, woodwind and keyboard through Soundstorm Music Education Agency, and private peripatetic teachers. Teachers visit the school and teach children in our dedicated music practise room.

We have a thriving Key Stage 2 Choir, which is run by a music specialist and regularly performs at school and in the wider community. We are in the process of setting up more music groups or ensembles.

Individual, small group lessons and the choir are funded by parents, however for those children who are Pupil Premium, these lessons can be subsidised by the Pupil Premium provision.

- Live and Inspired free music performance to all children, Nursery to Year 6.
- Years 4 performing to an audience at the end of their Wider Opportunities project.
- Peripatetic music performance to the children and parents.

In the future

In future years, our Music Development Plan aims to achieve the following:

- Introduction of a wider range of instruments on offer for small group or individual lessons.
- Introduction of further whole-class ensemble projects delivered by a music specialist.
- Further develop performance opportunities for our young musicians throughout the school year.
- Further develop music trips and visits for all children.
- Further develop engagement in extra-curricular music for Pupil Premium and SEND children.
