Implementation

In English lessons, children engage with high-quality texts featuring rich vocabulary to foster a love of writing. We use film clips and age-appropriate texts from Literacy Shed Plus to spark creativity. Lessons are sequenced to cover various text types, ensuring skill progression from Year 1 to Year 6. In Early Years, children develop writing skills through meaningful activities, practicing in real-life contexts like invitations and lists.

At Christ the King, we provide regular independent writing opportunities that incorporate key skills, allowing children to showcase their abilities. They self-assess by editing with purple polishing pens and highlighting writing targets. Writing is integrated across the curriculum.

Spelling, punctuation, and grammar are taught as discrete lessons, with an expectation that children apply these skills in their writing. Weekly spelling rules are explored through definitions, synonyms, antonyms, and sentence use, with practice included in home learning.
